
Please show us on Tapestry how the rhyme is coming along at home, or do you have a favourite rhyme you wish to share with us.

Making a journey stick is such an easy, fun outdoor craft to do with your children- and a great low-cost way to have some fun family time. It is perfect for inspiring kids to get creative with nature and explore the amazing natural world.

What is a journey stick?

A journey stick (also known as a story stick or nature stick) is essentially a memento of a nature walk, featuring items collected whilst on the walk. These might be things like leaves, twigs, flowers, feathers, or anything else natural that you find along the way. They tell the story of your journey and a great way for a child to begin story telling.
